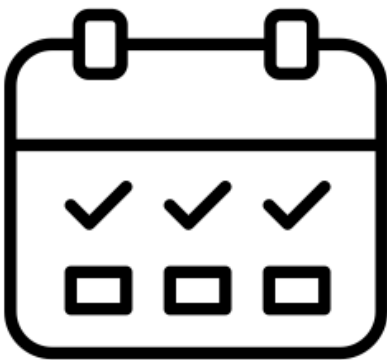


What to Expect



Who is it for?

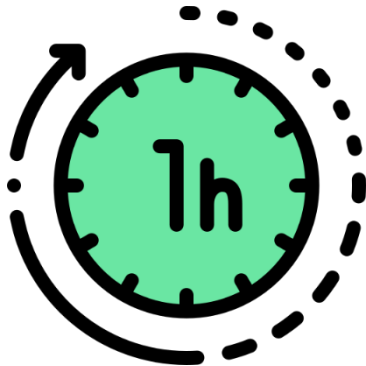
Pram People is for all ages. Young children in prams or wheelchairs and their grown-ups will be the people taking part.



Dates and Times:

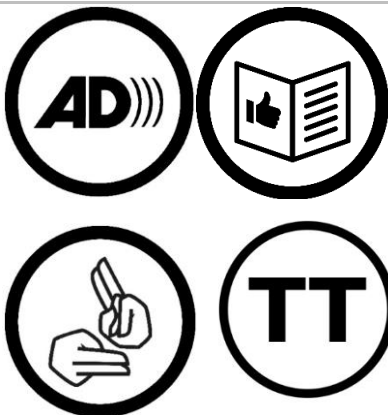
Sunday 25 - Monday 26 August

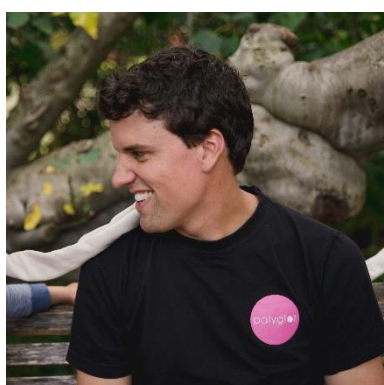

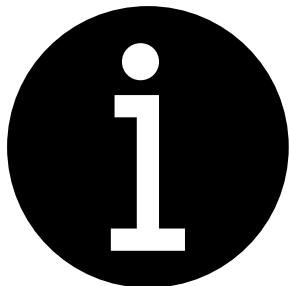
